ALUMNI RELATIONS

CAREER CENTER

166 employers came to the Fall 2011 Career Fair and 163 came in January 2012 to hire students for full-time jobs & internships.

DEVELOPMENT

The office of Corporate & Foundation Relations and Gift & Estate Planning have secured gifts and gift plans for a combined total of \$23,037,254 so far for fiscal year 2012.

Annual Giving: The Georgia Fund annual giving campaign raised a record \$11.6 million, a 13% increase from fiscal year 2010. Faculty & staff participation by the External Affairs division

in the FY 2011 campaign reached new heights with a 39% participation rate.

Advancement Research: Advancement Research had its most productive year on record in 2011 for both reactive and proactive research. Additionally, Research partnered with units, colleges & development officers across campus to improve prospect pools and to complete special projects in support of development efforts.

Donor Relations & Stewardship: November 15, 2011 marked the seventh year of mailing endowment reports to our donors. This year we stewarded 1336 funds, by mailing 1914 reports to various individuals and corporations.

Major Gifts: From August to October, the Regional Development team traveled to visit 376 alumni and donor/ friends closing over \$2.6 million in gifts for the University of Georgia.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (IT)

In 2011, External Affairs IT major suc-

cesses include: supporting the merger of the Arch foundation and the UGA foundation, development and deployment of the suite of Alumni websites, as well as beginning development on the University's new fundraising and constituent management system.

PUBLIC AFFAIRS

Public Affairs was the recipient of a CASE 2011 Circle of Excellence GOLD AWARD for Specific Media Relations Programs & Projects.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Everyone at the Office of Special Events pitched in to make the November 9th investiture of Hank Huckaby as the new Chancellor of the Board of Regents a very successful event. Governor Nathan Deal remarked that the investiture was the best-run event he had seen in the Capitol to date.
